Walking in Someone Else's Shoes

In 1993, I was serving in youth ministry in East Texas and seeking ways to encourage teenagers to grow in their faith in Christ. At that time, a nationwide campaign encouraged people to ask, "What would Jesus do?" Bracelets, shirts, and bumper stickers spread the reminder with the Letters, "WWJD." I thought it was a little "gimmicky" and didn't really buy into the hype. But later, I read "In His Steps" by Charles Sheldon. Published in 1896, Sheldon introduced the question, "What would Jesus Do" as a way to think through what it means to reflect the nature and character of Jesus in real-life situations. It wasn't about wearing a slogan. It is about putting on the mind of Christ.

In Philippians 2:3-7, Paul writes, "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus. who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men." That's spiritual health: thinking, serving, and loving like Jesus.

Imagine what would happen if, before every decision, we asked: "How would this affect someone else?" Walking in someone else's shoes means more than sympathy, it's empathy. It's seeing the world from another perspective and responding with the humility of Christ.

In a culture obsessed with self-expression, self-advancement, and self-fulfillment, Jesus shows us the opposite way. He emptied Himself, took on the form of a servant, and gave His life for others. That mindset is the path to true greatness.

Our challenge is to put this into practice daily: at home, at work, and in the church. When we walk in someone else's shoes, we look a little more like Jesus.

So ask yourself, "whose shoes do I need to step into this week so I can love them with the mind of Christ?" ~Bill
